ἄσοφοι not as fools – one with the opposite of wisdom "fool hath said in his heart there is no God", fool may have a lot of knowledge, but lacks the understanding to apply that knowledge. (fool – doesn't think through aforehand consequences)

Worship can incorporate **ALL KINDS OF MUSIC**. There is no "Christian music". There are only Christian lyrics. There is ample room in the Body of Christ to praise God with established psalms (praises), hymns (historical hymns), spiritual songs (songs that

resonate out of a worshipful heart like a harp being plucked.) Think of it as your heart being plucked by the Holy Spirit like a hand plucks a harp.

We should do all of this in a spirit of THANKSGIVING and SUBMITTING to one another. That means <u>sometimes singing what touches another more than it touches you</u> and to do so without complaining. CAN I GET AN AMEN! Whenever you get ready to say, "I don't really like that song" remember that you're subconsciously saying that it's all about you.
